Social Skills	Skill Streaming for Adolescents is the book used to teach students a variety of appropriate social skills. Students will learn how to ask for help, say thank you, disagree, deal with unexpected situations, etc.	Students will be able to apply the social skills learned in the real-world setting (home, community, school, job)	Students have homework each week to try the skill outside of school and report on it. They are graded on participation in class and completion of homework.
Math	Each day students work on a different concept: money, time, measurement, banking, shopping, basic math skills, etc.	Students will learn to apply this knowledge in the real-world setting post-high school.	Students are assessed on work within the classroom, as well as individually, when pulled in small groups.
English	Each day students do different concepts: reading menus, personal information, find main idea, calendars, finding important information, etc	Students learn how to apply these skills in the real-world setting post-high school.	Students are assessed on work within the classroom, as well as some individual, small group assessment.
CBI	Students learn about different job skills, understand that different jobs require different levels of training, learn personal strengths and weaknesses as well as interests, create realistic job goals based on ability/interests, and possibly do small jobs around the school.	Students learn these skills in order to apply them in the real-world job setting.	Students are assessed on work in the classroom, and their understanding of job related knowledge.
Science/Social Studies	Each day students learn different concepts: reading maps, weather, current events, safety, laws/expectations, community, etc	Students learn how to apply these skills in the real-world setting. They will need these skills post-high school.	Students are assessed on work in the classroom, and their ability to use these concepts.

Students each have IEP goals that are worked on throughout the school year, and assessed each marking period. These goals are geared toward life skills, and are taught within the CI Program.
