- To provide financial support for the enrichment of the music education programs at Kalkaska Public Schools.

- To increase the participation levels of the parents and students in the music programs.

- To obtain donations and perform fundraising activities to provide uniforms, equipment, instruction, and other necessities constructive to quality music programs and performances.

Below, you will find some of the most important information which will be needed to make your child's and your experiences with the KPS Music programs and Boosters beneficial to all. Let's get to it:

Instruments:

With the exception of very expensive instruments such as the sousaphone, students should own or rent to own instruments. A purchased instrument promotes care of the instrument, practice time, and responsibility. Marshall Music offers a rent to own program, along with direct purchase options. There are many other options via the internet such as Amazon and Craigslist. Mr. Chissus is happy to provide his professional recommendations prior to purchase.

Concerts & Other Performances:

<u>KHS Marching/Symphonic Band</u>- two concerts, one festival, 4 or 5 home football game and several home basketball game performances, one Trout Festival parade, graduation ceremony, and one exhibition performance.

KHS Jazz Band- will have several other local performances scheduled throughout the year. Optional are Honors Band and Solo & Ensemble Festival (S&E).

KMS 7/8 Grades Bandtwo concerts, one festival, one Trout Festival parade. 8th grade only- graduation ceremony. Optional are Honors Band and Solo & Ensemble Festival (S&E).

KMS 6th Grade Band- two concerts and one Trout Festival parade.

KHS Chorus- two concerts. There may be other performances scheduled throughout the year.

What Is A Festival?

A primary service of the MSBOA (Michigan School Band & Orchestra Association) is to organize various district and state wide festivals for member schools. These events allow middle and high school members to receive recognitions for their achievements in various musical ensembles.

Band and Orchestra Festival is an opportunity for ensembles from member schools to perform a program of three pieces for adjudication, one of which must be from MSBOA's required list.

Solo & Ensemble Festival (S & E) is an opportunity for individual students from member schools to perform a selection of their choice for adjudication.

KPS Band Students in grades 7 through 12 will participate in these festivals. Please consult the calendar of events for exact dates. Honors Band also falls under the umbrella of the MSBOA.

Uniforms:

There is a \$30 cleaning for <u>high school</u> students which covers both marching and concert uniforms. This fee is due before the last day of band camp. Students are expected to help maintain the appearance of their uniforms by hanging them properly after performances and making a uniform committee member aware of any sizing or repair issues.

KHS Marching- Full marching band uniforms are provided, solid black shoes and socks are required. Open-toe shoes/sandals are not uniform.

<u>KHS Symphonic</u>- Tuxedo pants, coats, and bow ties are provided for concert band. Solid black shoes and socks are required, as is a tuxedo shirt or dickie. Skirts, shorts, and open toed shoes/sandals are not uniform.

<u>KHS Jazz</u>- Solid black pants and button shirt, along with solid black shoes and socks are uniform. A jazz tie is provided.

Bandshoppe.com offers a variety of black marching shoes for under \$30 and tuxedo shirts. Locally, Captain's Quarters carries tux shirts.

<u>KMS-7/8 grade Band</u>- NEW this year- the sweaters are being replaced with parent purchased embroidered polo shirts to be worn for the holiday concert and festival. Information and an order form will be sent home in September. **Black pants, solid black shoes and socks are required.** For the Trout Festival parade and spring concert, the current year's band spirit shirt may be worn along with black pants, shoes and socks.

<u>KMS-6 grade Band</u>- For the holiday concert, students are to wear their "Sunday Best", no jeans or flip flops. For the Trout Festival parade and spring concert, the current year's band spirit shirt may be worn.

Sound Check (Chorus)- performance uniform to be determined prior to performance. Until Boosters is able to raise enough funds to purchase uniforms, usually the chorus wears black pants or skirts and either a solid red or white top.

Practice:

Practice makes perfect or, at least, helps get you closer to it. Even the most seasoned professional musicians practice their craft. Band students should practice a minimum of 20 minutes each day with more time devoted for leaning performance pieces for concerts, festivals, solos. Mr. Chissus offers a practice sheet which is available in the middle school music room or on the school district website, music department tab.

Smart Music:

Smart Music is a powerful online practice tool complete with accompaniment library. This subscription-based interactive practice software gives your child instant feedback while they practice at home – and a way to have fun while doing it! www.smartmusic.com

Music Lessons:

If your student takes private music lessons, the Boosters offer a scholarship to pay for each fourth lesson. The request form is available on the school district website or in both music rooms.

Summer Camp Programs:

Boosters offer scholarships to help with the costs of attending these summer camps: Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp, Interlochen Summer Arts Camp, Drum Major Camp and Color Guard Camp at CMU. The request form is available on the school district website or in both music rooms.

Field Trips/Overnight Trips:

Thirlby Field-HS band students perform their half-time show. Boosters would like to invite all 7/8 grade band students to attend with Boosters paying transportation costs. More details available closer to date.

<u>Ford Field</u> - Grades 8-12, Michigan Competing Band Association Championship. This is an overnight, chaperoned trip. Boosters pay for transportation and up to four adult chaperones plus the director and his wife.

Chicago? NYC? Disney World? Yes, it's possible. Mr. Chissus has taken his high school band students to each of these places, more than once. Sometimes, the trip is to perform, other times, to expose our kids to the large world of music and its endless possibilities. Boosters contribute a large portion of funding for these trips with students and their families responsible for the balance.

Trip Fund Accounts:

Each music student has a trip fund account where deposits may be made from a variety of fundraisers or through a direct deposit of cash or check. One of the fundraisers to add to the account is through the Boosters' Can You Spare A Dollar campaign. Launching at the beginning of each school year, this fundraiser allows students to earn their current year Music Spirit Shirt for free and raise additional funds for their trip account. Parents can earn credits to be added to their students trip account through their volunteer activity. *See details on the volunteering opportunities portion of this sheet.

Music Spirit Gear:

Each year, there will be a t-shirt offered to promote togetherness and band/chorus spirit. T-shirts may be earned through the Can you Spare A Dollar campaign mentioned above or purchased outright. It is strongly suggested that all music program members earn or purchase their Spirit Shirt as they are to be worn at different functions throughout the school year. Boosters pay 100% of the costs for the sixth grade t-shirts and they are given as a reward to the students for sticking with the band for the first marking period. Parents and other band supporters may order the shirts for \$15. Along with shirts, hoodies, sweat pants, and/or shirts may be offered, as well as a variety of other spirit gear items.

Fundraising:

Boosters are responsible for many music program needs which the school district budget no longer allows for. We strive to meet those responsibilities through fundraising that appeals to our community and not asking band families for continuous contributions. Our largest fundraiser is selling popcorn at all high school and middle school sporting events. We may also sell items that appeal to all Kalkaska Blazers such as car magnets, vinyl decals, etc. This year will mark our second spring rummage sale. The success of this sale depends on the quality and quantity of items donated for us to sell. There will be monthly donation dates advertised to encourage community members and music families to give us their no longer needed items

Earn Student Trip Credit While Volunteering!

Boosters contribute a significant portion of funding for these trips but students' families are responsible for the rest. We have a devised a way for you, and your student, to earn additional money towards the costs associated with these trips. Certain volunteer opportunities, denoted by an asterisk on the list of volunteer opportunities, will earn \$5 towards trip costs and will be deposited into the student's trip account.
