# Karen's Closet Wins Big at High School Charity Event

ommunity members, staff, and students raised \$4,445 to benefit Karen's Closet, the high school food and clothing pantry, during a charity volleyball tournament, silent auction, and bake sale held at the high school on January 26.

Karen's Closet was so named to honor Karen Hodgman, the founder and long-time supporter of the teen closet, after she passed away in 2020. She was also the wife of Richard Hodgman, a local doctor and school board trustee, and the mother of Mary Deb Rabourn, administrative assistant to the high school principal, Staci Short.

"My mom who inspired the teen closet, died of Covid, and for so long we couldn't hold these types of events because of Covid," Rabourn said. "It is so healing to the soul to be able to be a part of community events again where people come out and just have a good time. loved it, too!"

Jaime Dunn, who Rabourn said really picked up the torch of the teen pantry after Karen died, still volunteers her time and focuses on helping with fundraising and promotional ideas for Karen's Closet. She often picks up specific or specialty items for students when needed and is committed to helping the service continue.

The tournament was open to the entire community and many businesses and organizations paid the \$100 entry fee, along with staff and student teams, to benefit the cause. The "fun" of the event was evident on the court and with the names the teams gave themselves, such as: Setting Ducks, Guardians of the Principal, One Hit Wonders, and Spike Tysons.

Rabourn and Emilee Scott, KHS athletic secretary, organized the event and set a goal of \$3,000, which they more than exceeded. Rabourn said several participants said they would be willing to play again, so they will try to make it an annual event.

With the money earned, Rabourn said they plan to restock the clothing and shoes available for students as well as continue funding a new program that provides groceries to students who are in need.

"Kalkaska never fails to amaze me," Rabourn said. "I was so pleased with the number of people who chose to spend a long Thursday night here to raise money for our teens! The generosity of this small community is astounding, and it makes me extremely grateful to live here."


"We have visited Japan, England, and France, and are looking forward to exploring more of the world throughout the year. Bon Voyage!"











# **KPS** Building Project Coming Along
